



**Course Description:** BSI's "ISO 27001:2005 Requirements" competency-based 2-day course teaches a general understanding of the concepts of the ISO 27001:2005 standard and examines issues surrounding information security management systems (ISMS). An experienced instructor explains the clauses of ISO 27001:2005 in detail, providing a base for understanding the OECD Principles and includes auditing the requirements of the standard. Students learn by participating in group exercises and in-depth discussions.



This course covers the RABQSA TPECS IS – Information Security Management Systems Competency Unit whose outcomes are certified by RABQSA. Attendees successfully completing this course receive a Certificate of Attainment for this RABQSA Competency Unit.
